The Politicisaton of Economic Inequality: The Impact of Welfare Regimes, Elites' Discourse and Media Frames on Citizens' Perceptions, Justice Evaluations and Political Behaviour (POLINEQUAL)

### Project summary and background

POLINEQUAL aims to study the causes and mechanisms that motivate citizens to respond to economic inequalities. Conceptually, it is based on the assumption that:

- 1) individual perceptions of economic inequality are biased because they are mediated by evaluations of justice and therefore do not reflect objective levels of economic inequality,
- 2) perceptions of economic inequality are informed by facts, ideological cues, media representations and personal heuristics,
- 3) these perceptions and justice evaluations are malleable to the extent that economic inequality is politicized, and
- 4) perceptions and evaluations of economic inequality elicit emotional, attitudinal and behavioural responses.

POLINEQUAL follows two paths: First, it investigates the nature of the relationships between political discourses, media representations, ideological cues and individual perceptions and justice evaluations of economic inequality, and the extent to which these are conditioned by collectively shared norms of distributive justice. Second, it examines the impact of individual perceptions and evaluations of inequality on emotions and political behaviour. Its aim is to develop a theoretical framework that explains the causes and mechanisms of individual perceptions of economic inequality that depend on national institutional arrangements, ideological cues, media representations and personal heuristics. POLINEQUAL's research design is based on a mixed-method approach, organised in different stages and combining data from focus groups, analyses of political discourse and media content, online surveys and experimental studies. Pursuing a comparative perspective, POLINEQUAL data will be partly collected in France, Sweden and the UK.

The POLINEQUAL team will be composed of three PhD students, one postdoc and the project leader.

### Means and embeddedness of the PhD thesis in the project

The candidate will participate in the entire process of collecting qualitative, quantitative and experimental data and develop data analysis skills. Methodological training will be offered. In addition, the successful candidate will co-author publications and participate in national and international scientific conferences. Within this framework, the candidate will have to construct an original PhD thesis project based mainly but not exclusively on the project data collected.

### Constraints related to the position

The candidate must reside in the urban community of Grenoble, France, and participate regularly in the activities of PACTE, the research institute POLINEQUAL is affiliated with.

### **Expected skills and competences**

Proven skills in quantitative and statistical analysis

Knowledge of statistical software (Stata and/or SPSS)

Genuine interest in and willingness to collect and explore qualitative data (focus groups, political discourse and media representations); methodological training offered Excellent oral and written skills in English (project language)





### Requirements to apply

Hold a Master's degree (or equivalent) in political science, sociology or another discipline of the human and social sciences.

Having already worked on welfare states, economic inequality, moral economy, political attitudes or related topics will be an important selection criterion.

## **Selection process**

The selection will be made on the basis of the applications, completed by interviews (via videoconference call or face-to-face interview).
