

Regional Political Authority in comparative perspective (REGPOL-ALA) 1 full-time doctoral position/grant (3 years) in international relations/political science.

Offer description

This is a call for applications for one **full-time doctoral position in the framework of an ANR REGPOL-ALA research grant (ANR-JCJC)** at Université de Tours (France). The project is led by Kevin Parthenay (IRJI, Institut Universitaire de France).

The selected candidate will start on 1st of September 2023 and be funded by Université de Tours (via ANR) doctoral grant for 36 months.

Objectives of the project

This project has the ambition **to explore the surge of new forms of political authority beyond states, at the regional scale**. Comparing four regional organizations (ROs) in Africa and Latin America, the main objective is to identify the types, determinants and effects of regional political authority.

In order to address this question, the project builds on the intersection of IR institutionalisms, international political sociology, and international public administration. The project advances debates in the comparative regionalism and regional governance literatures by offering a context-sensitive framework of analysis of regional bureaucracies, staffs and practices. Methodologically, a mixed methods approach (prosopography, ethnographic observations and semi-structured interviews) supplemented by inter-regional comparisons (on the basis of three variables presented further) will advance debates in IR concerning the effects of cumulative micro-level factors (individual characteristics) on macro-transformations (regional political authority).

The ANR's Principal Investigator will focus on two Latin American cases while **the full-time doctoral position offered will focus specifically on the two African cases**: the East African Community (EAC, headquarter Arusha, Tanzania) and the South African Development Community (SADC, headquarter Gaborone, Botswana).

Within this framework, the PhD candidate will develop his/her doctoral research in the frame of the objectives described above and the methodological framework elaborated by the ANR's Principal Investigator.

- Good command of statistical softwares (web scraping skills are an asset)
- Show their ability to work in a team, to meet deadlines and to combine autonomy with respect of guidelines.

The research grant is provided for 3 years for a total amount of 110 540, 25€.
